- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-16 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to salary increases for unfillable positions.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 created and enacted as follows: 6 Salary increase - Unfillable position. 7 1. a. If, after the conclusion of a school calendar, the board of a school district has 8 a teaching position vacant and if the board, having done all things necessary 9 and proper, is unable to fill that position by the forty-fifth day prior to the start 10 of the district's school calendar with an individual who is highly qualified and 11 who meets reasonable criteria established by the board, the board shall notify 12 the superintendent of public instruction that: 13 (1) A teaching position is vacant; 14 <u>(2)</u> The board has done all things necessary and proper after learning of 15 the vacancy to find a suitable and highly qualified candidate; and 16 (3)The board will be unable to meet the statutory requirements for school 17 approval if the position remains unfilled. 18 Unless the superintendent of public instruction has reason to believe that the b. 19 information contained in the notice as provided in subdivision a is not 20 accurate, the superintendent shall authorize the board, notwithstanding the 21 terms of any agreement negotiated under this chapter, to increase the 22 compensation offered for that position to the extent deemed necessary by the 23 board in order to attract a suitable and highly qualified individual. The

1 compensation paid to a successful applicant under this section may not be 2 reduced in future years. 3 If a teaching position becomes vacant during a school calendar or less than 2. a. 4 forty-five days prior to the start of the school calendar, the board of a school 5 district shall do all things necessary and proper to ensure that the vacancy 6 causes only minimal disruption to the instruction of students and that the 7 position becomes filled as quickly as possible by a highly qualified individual 8 who meets the reasonable criteria established by the board. The board shall 9 notify the superintendent of public instruction that the vacancy exists and that 10 the board will be unable to meet the requirements for school approval if the 11 position remains unfilled. 12 <u>b.</u> Upon receipt of the notice as provided in subdivision a, the superintendent of 13 public instruction shall contact the several education associations in this state 14 and ask that they assist the board of the school district in any way possible to 15 locate and employ an individual under the terms of the district's existing 16 negotiated agreement. Only when the superintendent determines that all 17 reasonable efforts have been unsuccessful may the superintendent authorize 18 the board, notwithstanding the terms of any agreement negotiated under this 19 chapter, to offer the level of compensation it deems necessary in order to 20 attract a suitable and highly qualified individual for the duration of the school 21 calendar. 22 3. If an individual resigns from a teaching position with a district, the individual may 23 be rehired by the board of that district to fill a vacancy, but the individual is not 24 eligible to receive a level of compensation greater than that provided for in the 25 district's negotiated agreement. 26 If an individual has taught in this state during the preceding twelve months, the <u>4.</u> 27 individual is not eligible to receive a level of compensation greater than that 28 provided for in the district's negotiated agreement. 29 5. This section is applicable to contracts that are negotiated under this chapter and
