AN ACT to amend chapter 50 of the laws of 2008, enacting the public protection and general government budget; to amend chapter 53 of the laws of 2008, enacting the education, labor and family assistance budget; to amend chapter 54 of the laws of 2008, enacting the health and mental hygiene budget; and to amend chapter 55 of the laws of 2008, enacting the transportation, economic development and environmental conservation budget, in relation to the support of state government

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of chapter 50 of the laws of 2008, enacting the
2 public protection and general government budget, as amended by section 3
3 of chapter 55 of the laws of 2008 and section 1 of chapter 496 of the
4 laws of 2008, is amended by repealing the items herein below set forth
