12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
13	Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
14	from the named funds for the 2012-2013 fiscal year to the
15	state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the
16	expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all
17	monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of
18	the Alabama Statutes.
19	For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for
20	expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals
21	for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is
22	intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in
23	the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the
24	following definitions shall be applicable.
25	"Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total
26	of all fund sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts, grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013, to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections

41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay date falls.

The appropriation above includes a projected savings of \$100,000,000. The Medicaid Agency is directed to identify and achieve the \$100,000,000 in savings for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013. Methods for achieving savings should include strategies that can increase efficiency in the delivery of services; avoid duplicative and inappropriate payments and services; create provider payment models and incentives that reward improved quality, appropriate treatment, cost effectiveness, access and care coordination; as well as those that facilitate improved health outcomes. In identifying savings, the Medicaid Agency shall not consider decreasing reimbursement to those provider groups who for the 2013 fiscal year provide Medicaid with revenues from assessments exceeding 5% of the aggregate fiscal year ending 2011 net patient revenue of any such provider group. The Agency will utilize staff and experts to evaluate

In order to facilitate the receipt of federal funds in support of the Medicaid program, other state departments that participate in Medicaid will make additional transfers not related to paid claims to the Alabama Medicaid Agency from their state appropriations. Section 3. RETIREMENT COSTS. The appropriations made

herein to departments, boards, offices, commissions, agencies

and institutions include the amounts needed to pay

approximately \$174,000,000 in employer contribution expenses

Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012, to the various state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted on September 30, 2012, are hereby reappropriated to the respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2012.

Section 5. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 6. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013. Section 7. Except as may be herein otherwise provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated herein except as may be provided for under Sections 4, 5, 6, 9, 10, and 13 of this bill, as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those appropriations herein made, except appropriations to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the purchase of alcoholic beverages, are and shall be subject to the terms, conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 8. Any surplus remaining in any appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other

appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

Section 9. In addition to appropriations herein made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in the bill, including grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties, to any department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 10. Upon certification to the Director of Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or

other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such department, board, bureau or commission in the amount necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 11. All interest earned from funds paid into Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

Section 12. All encumbered balances of a previous fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal year immediately following the fiscal year for which the appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the appropriation or appropriations were made.

Section 13. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include the amounts necessary and said departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in this act and receiving services from other governmental agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for such services.

Section 14. All funds collected under Section 40-12-43.1 between the effective date of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2012 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for the administration of the examiner certification program established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1.

Section 15. It is the intent of the Legislature that the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President Pro Tempore in subsection 9 of Section 2A of this act which are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50 Code of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60 Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 16. If merit pay increases are reinstated after December 31, 2012, current anniversary dates will be maintained for all state employees. Agencies are prohibited from adjusting employee anniversary dates to obtain merit pay increases at an earlier date.

Section 17. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include the amounts necessary to pay the State Employee Health Insurance Board (SEIB). The SEIB rate shall be \$765 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013. The State Employees' Insurance Board will adjust the insurance program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned fixed rate. For the fiscal year 2013, the Governor upon the recommendation of the State Director of Finance, shall have the authority to increase the SEIB monthly employer insurance premium rate up to a maximum of \$805 per month for each full-time employee.

Section 18. In the appropriation in this Act to the Alabama Department of Public Health, the reference to Prostate Screening and Research refers to research performed at the Mitchell Cancer Institute. Of the above appropriation for Prostate Screening and Research, \$300,000 shall go to the Mitchell Cancer Institute with \$250,000 earmarked for cystic fibrosis research and \$50,000 for prostate cancer research.

Section 19. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate

Section 20. Section 21. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 22. All laws or parts of laws, general, special, private or local that are in conflict with or inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby expressly repealed.

Section 23. Each agency of the State funded through the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of this state without regard to sex or race.

Section 24. This act shall become effective October 1, 2012.
