NEW LAW 15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-124 of Title 63, unless there 16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 17 The Legislature finds that: 18 The people of the several states comprising the United 19 States of America created the federal government to be their agent 20 for certain enumerated purposes as set forth in the United States 21 Constitution, and nothing more; 22 The Tenth Amendment to the United States Constitution 23 defines the total scope of federal powers as being those which have

been delegated by the people of the several states to the federal

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- 1 government, and all powers not delegated to the federal government in the Constitution of the United States are reserved to the states 3 respectively, or to the people themselves. Furthermore, as stated in the Ninth Amendment, "The enumeration in the Constitution, of 5 certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people"; and
 - The assumption of power that the federal government has made 3. by enacting the "Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act" (Public Law 111-148, March 23, 2010) and "Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010" (Public Law 111-152, March 30, 2010) is nowhere expressly granted by the United States Constitution and interferes with the right of the people of the State of Oklahoma to regulate health care as they see fit.
 - A new section of law to be codified SECTION 2. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-125 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - Α. The Legislature of the State of Oklahoma declares that the federal laws known as the "Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act" (Public Law 111-148) and the "Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010" (Public Law 111-152), signed by President Barack Obama on March 23 and 30, 2010, are not authorized by the Constitution of the United States and violate its true meaning and intent as given by the founders and ratifiers, and are hereby declared to be invalid in the State of Oklahoma, shall not be

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1	recognized by this state, are specifically rejected by this state,
2	and shall be considered null and void and of no effect in this
3	state.
4	B. It shall be the duty of the Legislature of this state to
5	adopt and enact any and all measures as may be necessary to prevent
6	the enforcement of the "Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act"
7	and the "Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010"
8	within the limits of this state.
9	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
10	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
11	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
12	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
