13	K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 25-1122 and repealing the existing section pertain-
14	ing to presentation of photographic identification at time of vot-
15	ing; [pertaining to the operation of election boards;] amending
16	K.S.A. [25-2810 and K.S.A.] 2006 Supp. 25-1122, 25-1123, 25-
17	2309, 25-2908 and 25-3002 and repealing the existing sections.

19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
20	Section 1. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 25-1122 is hereby amended to read as
21	follows: 25-1122. (a) Any registered voter may file with the county elee-
22	tion officer where such person is a resident, or where such person is
23	authorized by law to vote as a former precinct resident, an application for
24	an advance voting ballot. The signed application shall be transmitted only
25	to the county election officer by personal delivery, mail, facsimile or as
26	<u>otherwise provided by law.</u>
27	<u>(b) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to</u>
28	be transmitted in person, and such voter is a first-time voter, such voter
29	shall provide a form of valid identification such as a current and valid
30	Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification card, utility bill, bank
31	statement, paycheck, government check or other government document
32	containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on the reg-
33	istration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide identification
34	if such voter has previously provided current and valid identification in
35	the county where registered.
36	<u>(e) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting ballot to</u>
37	be transmitted by mail, and such voter is a first-time voter, such voter
38	shall provide on the application for an advance voting ballot the voter's
39	current and valid Kansas driver's license number, nondriver's identifica-
40	tion card number or the last four digits of the voter's social security num-
41	ber, or shall provide with the application a copy of the voter's current and
42	valid Kansas driver's license, nondriver's identification eard, utility bill,
43	bank statement, paycheek, government cheek or other government doe-

1 ument containing the voter's current name and address as indicated on 2 the registration book. Such voter shall not be required to provide iden-3 tification if such voter has previously provided current and valid identification in the county where registered. 4 (d) If a first-time voter is unable or refuses to provide current and $\mathbf{5}$ valid identification, or if the name and address do not match the voter's 6 7 name and address on the registration book, the voter may vote a provisional ballot according to K.S.A. 25-409, and amendments thereto. The 8 9 voter shall provide a valid form of identification as defined in subsection (c) of this section to the county election officer in person or provide a 10 copy by mail or electronic means before the meeting of the county board 11 12of canvassers. At the meeting of the county board of canvassers the county election officer shall present copies of identification received from pro-13 visional voters and the corresponding provisional ballots. If the county 1415 board of canvassers determines that a voter's identification is valid and the provisional ballot was properly east, the ballot shall be counted. 16(c) Applications for advance voting ballots to be transmitted to the 1718voter by mail shall be filed only at the following times: 19(1) For the primary election occurring on the first Tuesday in August 20in even-numbered years, between April 1 of such year and the last busi-21ness day of the week preceding such primary election. 22For the general election occurring on the Tuesday succeeding the (2)first Monday in November in even-numbered years, between 90 days 23 prior to such election and the last business day of the week preceding 24 such general election. 25-For the primary election held five weeks preceding the first Tues-26day in April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last 27 28business day of the week preceding such primary election. 29 (4) For the general election occurring on the first Tuesday in April, 30 between January 1 of the year of such election and the last business day of the week preceding such general election. 3132 (5) For question submitted elections occurring on the date of a primary or general election, the same as is provided for ballots for election 33 34 of officers at such election. 35 (6) For question submitted elections not occurring on the date of a primary or general election, between the time of the first published notice 36 37 thereof and the last business day of the week preceding such question 38 submitted election, except that if the question submitted election is held 39 on a day other than a Tuesday, the county election officer shall determine 40 the final date for mailing of advance voting ballots, but such date shall not be more than three business days before such election. 41(7) For any special election of officers, at such time as is specified by 42

43 the secretary of state.

1 (8) For the presidential preference primary, between January 1 2 the year in which such primary is held and the last business day of the 3 week preceding such primary election. The county election officer of any county may receive applications prior 4 to the time specified in this subsection (e) and hold such applications $\mathbf{5}$ until the beginning of the preseribed application period. Such applications 6 7 shall be treated as filed on that date. 8 (f) Unless an earlier date is designated by the county election office, 9 applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in person in the office of the county election officer shall be filed on the Tuesday 10next preceding the election and on each subsequent business day until 11 12no later than 12:00 noon on the day preceding such election. If the county election officer so provides, applications for advance voting ballots trans-13 mitted to the voter in person in the office of the county election officer 1415also may be filed on the Saturday preceding the election. Upon receipt of any such properly executed application, the county election officer shall 16deliver to the voter such ballots and instructions as are provided for in 1718this act. 19An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a voter who has a 20temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the English language or by a person rendering assistance to such voter may 21be filed during the regular advance ballot application periods until the 22 23 elose of the polls on election day. - In any county having a population exceeding 250,000, The county elee-24 25tion officer may designate places other than the central county election 26office as satellite advance voting sites. At any satellite advance voting site, 27 a registered voter may obtain an application for advance voting ballots, such ballots and instructions shall be delivered to the voter in the same 2829 manner and subject to the same limitations as otherwise provided by this 30 subsection. Applications for per-34 manent advance voting status shall be in the form and contain such in-35 formation as is required for application for advance voting ballots and also shall contain information which establishes the voter's right to permanent 36 37 advance voting status. 38 - (h) On receipt of any application filed under the provisions of this 39 section, the county election officer shall prepare and maintain in such 40 officer's office a list of the names of all persons who have filed such applications, together with their correct post office address and the pre-4142einet, ward, township or voting area in which such persons elaim to be

1 residents and the present resident address of each applicant. Such names 2 and addresses shall remain so listed until the day of such election. The county election officer shall maintain a separate listing of the names and 3 addresses of persons qualifying for permanent advance voting status. All 4 such lists shall be available for inspection upon request in compliance $\mathbf{5}$ with this subsection by any registered voter during regular business hours. 6 7 The county election officer upon receipt of such applications shall enter 8 upon a record kept by such officer the name and address of each appli-9 eant, which record shall conform to the list above required. Before inspection of any advance voting ballot application list, the person desiring 10 to make such inspection shall provide to the county election officer iden-11 12tification in the form of driver's license or other reliable identification and 13 shall sign a log book or application form maintained by such officer stating such person's name and address and showing the date and time of in-1415 spection. All records made by the county election officer shall be subject 16to public inspection, except that the voter identification information required by subsections (b) and (c) and the identifying number on ballots 1718and ballot envelopes and records of such numbers shall not be made 19public. (i) If a person on the permanent advance voting list fails to vote in 2021two consecutive general elections held on the Tuesday succeeding the 22 first Monday in November of each even-numbered year, the county elee-23 tion officer may mail a notice to such voter. Such notice shall inform the voter that the voter's name will be removed from the permanent advance 24 25voting list unless the voter renews the application for permanent advance 26voting status within 30 days after the notice is mailed. If the voter fails to renew such application, the county election officer shall remove the 27 28voter's name from the permanent advance voting list. Failure to renew 29 the application for permanent advance voting status shall not result in 30 removal of the voter's name from the voter registration list. For the purposes of this section, "first-time voter" means a reg-3132 istered voter who has not previously voted in any election in the county in which the voter desires to vote. First-time voter includes a person 33 34 whose name was removed from the county registration list in accordance 35 with K.S.A. 25-2316c, and amendments thereto, and who has re-36 registered. A signature may be made by another person 22 at the voter's direction if the signature reflects such voter's intention. 23 The election officer shall compare the voter's signature on the registra-24 tion book with the signature on the photographic identification provided 25by the voter. If the election official is satisfied as to the identity of the 26voter, the election official shall provide to the voter an advance voting 27 ballot. If the photographic identification does not contain the signature 28of the voter, an additional form of identification that provides the voter's 29 signature shall be required from the voter. The additional form of iden-30 tification shall comply with the provisions of subsection (i) of K.S.A. 25-

31 2908 and amendments thereto.

32 (c) If the registered voter is applying for an advance voting bal-33 lot to be transmitted by mail, and such voter is a first-time voter, such 34 voter shall provide on the application for an advance voting ballot 35 the voter's current and valid Kansas driver's license number, non-36 driver's identification card number or the last four digits of the 37 voter's social security number, or shall provide with the application 38 a copy of the voter's current and valid Kansas driver's license, non-39 driver's identification card, utility bill, bank statement, paycheek, gov-40 ernment check or other government document containing the voter's 41current name and address as indicated on the registration book. 42Such voter shall not be required to provide identification if such voter 43 has previously provided current and valid identification in the county

1 where registered.

2 (d) If a first-time voter is unable or refuses to provide current 3 and valid identification, or if the name and address do not match the voter's name and address on the registration book, the voter 4 may vote a provisional ballot according to K.S.A. 25-409, and $\mathbf{5}$ 6 amendments thereto. The voter shall provide a valid form of iden-7 tification as defined in subsection (c) of this section to the county 8 election officer in person or provide a copy by mail or electronic 9 means before the meeting of the county board of canvassers. At the 10 meeting of the county board of canvassers the county election officer shall present copies of identification received from provisional 11 12voters and the corresponding provisional ballots. If the county 13 board of canvassers determines that a voter's identification is valid 14and the provisional ballot was properly cast, the ballot shall be 15 counted.

16 (e) Applications for advance voting ballots to be transmitted to 17 the voter by mail shall be filed only at the following times:

(1) For the primary election occurring on the first Tuesday in
 August in even-numbered years, between April 1 of such year and
 the last business day of the week preceding such primary election.

(2) For the general election occurring on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November in even-numbered years, between
90 days prior to such election and the last business day of the week
preceding such general election.

(3) For the primary election held five weeks preceding the first
Tuesday in April, between January 1 of the year of such election
and the last business day of the week preceding such primary
election.

(4) For the general election occurring on the first Tuesday in
 30 April, between January 1 of the year of such election and the last
 31 business day of the week preceding such general election.

(5) For question submitted elections occurring on the date of a
 primary or general election, the same as is provided for ballots for
 election of officers at such election.

35 For question submitted elections not occurring on the date **(6)** 36 of a primary or general election, between the time of the first published notice thereof and the last business day of the week preceding 37 38 such question submitted election, except that if the question sub-39 mitted election is held on a day other than a Tuesday, the county election officer shall determine the final date for mailing of advance 40 voting ballots, but such date shall not be more than three business 4142days before such election.

1 ified by the secretary of state.

2 (8) For the presidential preference primary, between January 1
3 of the year in which such primary is held and the last business day

9 (**f**) Unless an earlier date is designated by the county election office, applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the 10 voter in person in the office of the county election officer shall be 11 12filed on the Tuesday next preceding the election and on each sub-13 sequent business day until no later than 12:00 noon on the day 14preceding such election. If the county election officer so provides, 15applications for advance voting ballots transmitted to the voter in 16person in the office of the county election officer also may be filed 17on the Saturday preceding the election. Upon receipt of any such properly executed application, the county election officer shall de-18 19liver to the voter such ballots and instructions as are provided for 20in this act.

An application for an advance voting ballot filed by a voter who has a temporary illness or disability or who is not proficient in reading the English language or by a person rendering assistance to such voter may be filed during the regular advance ballot application periods until the close of the polls on election day.

In any county having a population exceeding 250,000, The county election officer may designate places other than the central county election office as satellite advance voting sites. At any satellite advance voting site, a registered voter may obtain an application for advance voting ballots, such ballots and instructions shall be delivered to the voter in the same manner and subject to the same limitations as otherwise provided by this subsection.

All such lists shall 8 be available for inspection upon request in compliance with this 9 subsection by any registered voter during regular business hours.
