AN ACT to amend the civil service law and the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the collective bargaining process for certain peace officers and special officers

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 212 of the civil service law is amended by adding a 2 new subdivision 4 to read as follows:

- 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, 4 all collective negotiations in which the city of New York is a participant with the department of education of the city of New York, the New 6 York city health and hospital corporation, the New York city housing authority, or the city university of New York, all matters, including 8 but not limited to pensions, overtime, and time and leave rules which affect employees granted peace officer or special officer status pursu-10 ant to the criminal procedure law shall be negotiated with the certified employee organizations representing such employees.
- \S 2. Subparagraph (i) of paragraph 4 of subdivision a of section 12-307 of the administrative code of the city of New York, as amended by 14 local law number 56 of the city of New York for the year 2005, is 15 amended to read as follows:
- (i) employees of the uniformed fire service shall also include persons 17 employed at any level of position or service by the fire department of 18 the city of New York as fire alarm dispatchers and supervisors of fire 19 alarm dispatchers, fire protection inspectors and supervisors of fire 20 protection inspectors, emergency medical technicians and advanced emer-21 gency medical technicians, as those terms are defined in section three 22 thousand one of the public health law, [and] supervisors of emergency 23 medical technicians or advanced emergency medical technicians, and 24 <u>supervisors of blasting</u>;
- 25 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
