AN ACT to amend the elder law, in relation to establishing a program to encourage retirees to make their homes in New York state

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The elder law is amended by adding a new section 209-a to 2 read as follows:

- § 209-a. New York certified retirement community program. 1. For the purposes of this section, "certified retirement community" shall mean any city, town, village, or portion thereof, that contains or has conveniently available those amenities that are of particular need or interest to persons who are retired or who plan to retire, and has been so designated by the director of the office for the aging. Such designation shall be for a duration of not less than five years, and may be renewed thereafter by making application to such director.
- 2. The director of the office for the aging shall, within such office, establish a New York certified retirement community program. The purpose of such program shall be to:
- (a) promote the cities, towns, villages and portions thereof as retirement destinations to retirees and prospective retirees, for purposes of community and economic development, and as a means of enriching the state and its communities; and
- (b) assist such cities, towns, villages and portions thereof in providing amenities that retirees would find attractive.
- 3. The director of the office for the aging shall adopt rules and regulations providing for the manner in which a city, town, village or portion thereof may be designated and retain its status as a certified retirement community. When adopting such rules and regulations, such director shall consult with the department of economic development, the

department of health, the division of housing and community renewal, the New York state tourism council and other appropriate agencies.

4. In order to be designated as a certified retirement program pursuant to this section, the governing body of a city, town or village shall submit an application, upon such form as shall be established therefor by the director of the office for the aging, accompanied by a resolution

- of such body stating its intent to be certified as a retirement community, together with supporting data that shall state the ability of the 9 community to provide such amenities as adult education, employment 10 opportunities, shopping, recreation, cultural opportunities, safety, transportation, housing, and a continuum of health care, assisted living and community-based services appropriate to retirees.
 - 5. Upon designation of a city, town, village or portion thereof as a certified retirement community, the city, town, village or portion thereof shall establish a retirement community steering committee and not less than four subcommittees as follows:
 - (a) a "community amenities subcommittee", which shall develop a portfolio containing an unbiased inventory of community amenities as provided in this section;
 - (b) a "community relations/fundraising subcommittee" which shall raise funds required to conduct the program, organize special events, and promote and coordinate the program with local entities;
 - (c) a "marketing and promotion subcommittee" which shall develop a marketing plan, and coordinate advertising and public relations; and
 - (d) an "ambassadors subcommittee" which shall maintain contact with prospective retirees, respond to inquiries from such prospects, log contacts made, provide tours and invite prospects to special community
 - 6. Upon being designated as a certified retirement community, the director of the office for the aging shall, within funds appropriated to the New York certified retirement community program, provide such community such ongoing assistance as:
 - (a) training of local staff and volunteers;

- (b) oversight and quidance in marketing, and updating on national <u>retirement trends;</u>
- (c) promoting the community through inclusion in the state's national advertising and public relations campaigns, travel show promotions and on appropriate state Internet web sites; and
- (d) financial assistance for brochures, support material and advertis-<u>ing.</u>
- 7. The director of the office for the aging shall include in the annual report of such office, an update on the designation and status of certified retirement communities within the state.
- 8. The director of the office for the aging may seek and shall be entitled to receive from other state agencies such assistance as may be required to perform such director's duties pursuant to this section.
- § 2. This act shall take effect on the first of July of the calendar 47 year next succeeding the year in which it shall have become a law. 48
