- 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the joint session previously scheduled by HR 1433 for
- 18 February 24, 2010, for the purpose of hearing a message from the Chief Justice of the
- 19 Supreme Court shall be rescheduled at a later date and the Secretary of the Senate shall
- 20 transmit a copy of this resolution to the Chief Justice, to each other Justice of the Supreme
- 21 Court, and to each Judge of the Court of Appeals.
- 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the provisions of this resolution shall control over and
- 23 supersede those of HR 1262 which shall be of no further force or effect.
