All positions supported by 232 233 funds available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 shall be designated as time-limited positions. 234 235 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 236 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 237 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 238 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 239 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 240 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 241 242 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 243 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 248 **SECTION 4.** The Commissioner of Public Safety may, on a 249 case-by-case basis, within funds available, recommend that

corrective salary adjustments be made to the compensation of
employees of the Department of Public Safety where an inequity was
created between employees of equivalent capacity by previous
application of the agency appropriation acts. Any such corrective
salary adjustment plan must have prior approval by the State
Personnel Board. Such adjustments will not be retroactive.

Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe Benefits major object of expenditure may be used to purchase accumulated compensatory time within funds available.

SECTION 5. The Commissioner of Public Safety shall have the authority to transfer both positions and/or State General Funds appropriated herein from any division within the Department of Public Safety to any other division within the Department of Public Safety, not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%).

SECTION 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that the local governments pay for part of the computer cost of the Mississippi Justice Information Center by maintaining their contribution to the Department of Public Safety.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Public Safety designate certain employees to aid the Division of Crime Laboratories in the billing and collecting of all fees charged for services rendered by the Division of Crime Laboratories.

SECTION 8. No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be transferred to, expended by, or used, directly or indirectly, for the benefit of any public relations, publicity or publication activities of any other state agency, department or officer, nor shall any personnel paid with funds appropriated herein be transferred or assigned to any other state agency, department or officer for public relations, publicity, or publication activities of such office.

304	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized

A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2012.

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that all divisions within the Mississippi Department of Public Safety shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2010. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2012 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2011 budget request process.

**SECTION 14.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
392 of Section 2, funds may be expended to defray the costs of
393 clothing for sworn nonuniform law enforcement officers in an
394 amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually per
395 officer.

whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. - 424 (e) Utilize Mississippi-owned media companies when
- 425 feasible.
- 426 **SECTION 18.** Of the funds provided herein, and in addition to
- 427 the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) authorized in Section 45-3-7,
- 428 Mississippi Code of 1972, Department of Public Safety Officers who
- 429 are licensed commercial pilots shall receive an additional Nine
- 430 Hundred Dollars (\$900.00), for a total of One Thousand Dollars
- 431 (\$1,000.00), additional compensation for such service.
- 432 **SECTION 19.** It is the direction of the Legislature that all
- 433 Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) nonexempt sworn officers of the
- 434 Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol who are working one hundred
- 435 seventy-one (171) hours in a twenty-eight-day work cycle be
- 436 compensated based on the annual salary established by the State
- 437 Personnel Board for a one-hundred-sixty-hour per month schedule
- 438 divided by two thousand eighty-seven and one hundred forty-three

one thousandths (2,087.143), for an hourly rate, to be multiplied by two thousand two hundred twenty-three (2,223) or one hundred seventy-one (171) hours in a twenty-eight-day work cycle for a new annual salary. All hours worked over one hundred seventy-one (171) hours in a twenty-eight-day schedule shall by governed by the FLSA or other special compensation plan. All realignments after July 1, 2010, shall be calculated using this formula. This section shall be known as the "David R. Huggins Act." SECTION 20. In addition to all other sums appropriated

herein, Three Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$325,000.00) is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Public Safety for the purposes of paying for eleven (11) hours of compensatory time at an hourly rate based on 2,087.143 hours per year for sworn officers who hold the rank of Lieutenant and above. The funds provided in this section to pay for the eleven (11) hours authorized in this section shall be expended only for this purpose.

SECTION 21. It is the intention of the Legislature that this agency shall have the authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source that may become available to them as a result of the passage of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

The Executive Director of the Department of Finance and Administration shall have the authority to approve escalations of funds and employee positions using funds from any source available due to the passage of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

The Executive Director of the Department of Finance and
Administration shall immediately send notice of the approval of
such budget escalation to the House of Representatives

- 471 Appropriations Committee, the Senate Appropriations Committee and 472 the Legislative Budget Office. Within fifteen (15) days of such 473 approval, the Executive Director of the Department of Finance and 474 Administration shall ensure that the Legislative Budget Office 475 receives detailed and accurate information about the amount and 476 use of federal and special source funds by state agencies as a 477 result of the passage of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. 478
- SECTION 22. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 479 Department of Public Safety shall provide an annual report to the 480 481 Mississippi Legislature detailing any elected official or any 482 other person who is not an employee of the Department of Public Safety who was transported in Highway Patrol aircraft during the 483 484 fiscal year. The report shall be provided to each member of the 485 Mississippi Legislature on or before January 15, 2011.
  - SECTION 23. Of the funds provided within this act, no former employee who is receiving State of Mississippi retirement benefits shall be hired under contract for an amount exceeding Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) a year without prior approval by an agency's proper governing board or authority. Upon approval of such contracts a written report shall be submitted detailing the cost and need of contract services to the Chairmen and members of the Senate and House Appropriation Committees.
- 494 SECTION 24. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 495 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 496 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 497 498 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 499
- 500 SECTION 25. This act shall take effect and be in force from 501 and after July 1, 2010.
