A BILL

11 TO AMEND SECTION 111720, AS AMENDED, CODE OF
12 LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, RELATING TO
13 ENTITIES WHOSE EMPLOYEES, RETIREES, AND THEIR
14 DEPENDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE
15 STATE HEALTH AND DENTAL INSURANCE PLANS, SO AS
16 TO EXTEND THIS ELIGIBILITY TO JOINT AGENCIES
17 ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 23, TITLE 6.

18 Amend Title To Conform

20 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of South
21 Carolina:

22 SECTION 1. Section 111720(A) of the 1976 Code, as last
23 amended by Act 353 of 2008, is further amended by adding an
24 appropriately numbered item at the end to read:

27 " () joint agencies established pursuant to Chapter 23, Title 6."

29 SECTION 2. Article 5, Chapter 11, Title 1 of the 1976 Code is
30 amended by adding:

32 “Section 111715. The Employee Insurance Program of the
33 Budget and Control Board is directed to develop and implement,
34 for employees and their spouses who participate in the health plans
35 offered by the Employee Insurance Program, an incentive plan to
36 encourage participation in programs offered by the Employee
37 Insurance Program that promote health and the prevention of
38 disease. The Employee Insurance Program is further directed to
39 implement a premium reduction or other financial incentive,
40 beginning on January 1, 2012, for those employees and their
41 spouses who participate in these programs.”

1 SECTION 3. Section 111720(A)(7) of the 1976 Code is amended
2 to read:

4 "7) special purpose districts created by act of the General
5 Assembly that provide gas, water, fire, sewer, recreation, ~~or~~
6 hospital, or sanitation service, or any combination of these
7 services;"

9 SECTION 4. This act takes effect upon approval by the Governor.
