

1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The University of Illinois Act is amended by
5 changing Section 7f as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 305/7f) (from Ch. 144, par. 28f)

7 Sec. 7f. Partial tuition waivers.

8 (a) As used in this Section:7

9 "Employee" means an employee of an Illinois college or
10 university (i) who is a veteran at the time a waiver under this
11 Section is granted, (ii) who is the parent of a veteran who is
12 applying for a waiver under this Section, or (iii) whose annual
13 household income is \$50,000 or less at the time a waiver under
14 this Section is granted.

15 "Illinois college or university" means any of the
16 following: the University of Illinois, Southern Illinois
17 University, Chicago State University, Eastern Illinois
18 University, Governors State University, Illinois State
19 University, Northeastern Illinois University, Northern
20 Illinois University, and Western Illinois University.

21 "Veteran" means an Illinois resident who has served as a
22 member of the United States Armed Forces on active duty or
23 State active duty, a member of the Illinois National Guard, or

1 a member of the United States Reserve Forces and who has
2 received an honorable discharge.

3 (b) Each year the Board of Trustees of the University of
4 Illinois shall offer 50% tuition waivers for undergraduate
5 education at any campus under its governance or supervision to
6 the children of employees of an Illinois college or university
7 who have been employed by any one or by more than one Illinois
8 college or university for an aggregate period of at least 7
9 years. To be eligible to receive a partial tuition waiver, the
10 child of an employee of an Illinois college or university (i)
11 must be under the age of 25 at the commencement of the academic
12 year during which the partial tuition waiver is to be
13 effective, and (ii) must qualify for admission to the
14 University of Illinois under the same admissions requirements,
15 standards and policies which the University of Illinois applies
16 to applicants for admission generally to its respective
17 undergraduate colleges and programs.

18 (c) Subject to the provisions and limitations of subsection
19 (b), an eligible applicant who has continued to maintain
20 satisfactory academic progress toward graduation may have his
21 or her partial tuition waiver renewed until the time as he or
22 she has expended 4 years of undergraduate partial tuition
23 waiver benefits under this Section.

24 (d) No partial tuition waiver offered or allocated to any
25 eligible applicant in accordance with the provisions of this
26 Section shall be charged against any tuition waiver limitation

1 established by the Illinois Board of Higher Education.

2 (e) The Board of Trustees shall prescribe rules and
3 regulations as are necessary to implement and administer the
4 provisions of this Section.

7 Act is amended by changing Section 8f as follows:

9 Sec. 8f. Partial tuition waivers.

10 (a) As used in this Section:7

11 "Employee" means an employee of an Illinois college or
12 university (i) who is a veteran at the time a waiver under this
13 Section is granted, (ii) who is the parent of a veteran who is
14 applying for a waiver under this Section, or (iii) whose annual
15 household income is \$50,000 or less at the time a waiver under
16 this Section is granted.

17 "Illinois college or university" means any of the
18 following: the University of Illinois, Southern Illinois
19 University, Chicago State University, Eastern Illinois
20 University, Governors State University, Illinois State
21 University, Northeastern Illinois University, Northern

9 college or university for an aggregate period of at least 7
10 years. To be eligible to receive a partial tuition waiver, the
11 child of an employee of an Illinois college or university (i)
12 must be under the age of 25 at the commencement of the academic
13 year during which the partial tuition waiver is to be
14 effective, and (ii) must qualify for admission to Southern
15 Illinois University under the same admissions requirements,
16 standards and policies which Southern Illinois University
17 applies to applicants for admission generally to its respective
18 undergraduate colleges and programs.

19 (c) Subject to the provisions and limitations of subsection
20 (b), an eligible applicant who has continued to maintain
21 satisfactory academic progress toward graduation may have his
22 or her partial tuition waiver renewed until the time as he or
23 she has expended 4 years of undergraduate partial tuition
24 waiver benefits under this Section.

25 (d) No partial tuition waiver offered or allocated to any
26 eligible applicant in accordance with the provisions of this

1 Section shall be charged against any tuition waiver limitation
2 established by the Illinois Board of Higher Education.

3 (e) The Board of Trustees shall prescribe rules and
4 regulations as are necessary to implement and administer the
5 provisions of this Section.

16 same admissions requirements, standards and policies which
17 Chicago State University applies to applicants for admission
18 generally to its respective undergraduate colleges and
19 programs.

21 (b), an eligible applicant who has continued to maintain
22 satisfactory academic progress toward graduation may have his
23 or her partial tuition waiver renewed until the time as he or

18 same admissions requirements, standards and policies which

22 same admissions requirements, standards and policies which
23 Western Illinois University applies to applicants for
24 admission generally to its respective undergraduate colleges
25 and programs.
