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Senate Bill No. 30

(By Senators D. Hall, Trump, Blair, Williams and Karnes)

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §19-1-7, relating to shared animal ownership agreements to consume raw milk; acquiring percentage ownership interest in a milk-producing

animal and its raw milk; requiring written document acknowledging the inherent dangers of consuming raw milk; agreeing not to distribute raw milk; requiring reporting of herd-sharing agreements to Commissioner of Agriculture and Commissioner of Bureau for Public Health; requiring physicians to report any disease related to consumption of raw milk to local health department; providing for rule-making authority to set out the contents of the report; and requiring herd seller to meet animal health and testing requirements established by state veterinarian.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §19-1-7, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 1. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

§19-1-7. Shared animal ownership agreement to consume

raw milk.

- 1 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of the law to
- 2 the contrary, a responsible party may enter into a written
- 3 shared animal ownership agreement to consume raw milk in
- 4 which he or she:
- 5 (1) Acquires a percentage ownership interest in a 6 milk-producing animal;
- 7 (2) Agrees to pay another for the percentage
- 8 ownership interest for the care and boarding of the milk-
- 9 producing animal at the dairy farm;
- 10 (3) Is entitled to receive a fair share of the animal's
- 11 raw milk production as a condition of the contractual
- 12 agreement;
- 13 (4) Agrees to sign a written document acknowledging
- 14 the inherent dangers of consuming raw milk that may contain
- 15 bacteria, such as Brucella, Campylobacter, Listeria,
- 16 Salmonella and E. Coli, that has not been pasturized to

- 1 remove bacteria and that is particularly dangerous to children,
- 2 pregnant women and those with compromised immunity. The
- 3 responsible party then agrees to release of the herd seller of
- 4 liability for the inherent dangers of consuming raw milk; and
- 5 (5) Agrees not to distribute raw milk.
- 6 (b) The agreement provided in subsection (a) of this
- 7 section is required to be reported by one or both of the parties
- 8 to the agreement to both the Commissioner of Agriculture, or
- 9 his or her designee, as set forth in this article and the
- 10 Commissioner of the Bureau for Public Health, or his or her
- 11 designee, as set forth in article one, chapter sixteen of this
- 12 code.
- 13 (c) The herd seller shall meet the animal health
- 14 requirements for milk-producing animals established by the
- 15 state veterinarian, in accordance with state and national
- 16 standards, including the following:
- 17 (1) Raw milk from milk-producing animals intended

- 1 for consumption shall be from a herd that tested negative
- 2 within the previous twelve months for brucellosis,
- 3 tuberculosis and other diseases as required by the state
- 4 veterinarian. Additions to the herd shall test negative for the
- 5 diseases within the previous thirty days before introduction
- 6 into the herd; and
- 7 (2) Milk-producing animals producing bloody, stringy
- 8 or abnormal milk, but with only slight inflammation of the
- 9 udder, shall be excluded from the milking herd until
- 10 reexamination shows that the milk has become normal. Milk-
- 11 producing animals showing chronic mastitis, whether
- 12 producing abnormal milk or not, shall be permanently
- 13 excluded from the milking herd.
- 14 (d) Any physician licensed by either the provisions of
- 15 article three, chapter thirty of this code or article fourteen of
- 16 said chapter who makes a diagnosis that can be directly
- 17 attributed to the consumption of raw milk is required to report

- 1 nonidentifying information related to the diagnosis or
- 2 treatment to the local health officer of the county in which the
- 3 individual lives. The Secretary of the Department of Health
- 4 and Human Resources shall propose rules for legislative
- 5 approval in accordance with the provisions of article three,
- 6 chapter twenty-nine-a of this code regarding the contents of
- 7 the report required pursuant to this subsection.
