8	EXPRESSING THE INTENTION OF THE LEGISLATURE NOT TO
9	EXPAND MEDICAID SERVICES IN ALABAMA.

11	WHEREAS, the federal government authorized the
12	expansion of Medicaid services as a provision of the federally
13	mandated Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; and
14	WHEREAS, the expansion of Medicaid, as provided for
15	in the Affordable Care Act, or through waivers, would cause
16	future bodies of the Alabama Legislature and the taxpayers of
17	Alabama to share the cost for many years; and
18	WHEREAS, Medicaid expansion would dramatically
19	increase the number of Alabamians dependent upon public
20	assistance; and
21	WHEREAS, the state should pursue reforms based on
22	reducing Medicaid dependence, rather than increasing
23	dependence; and
24	WHEREAS, the federal government has rejected all
25	state-proposed work requirements tied to Medicaid eligibility
26	under expansion through waivers; and

1 WHEREAS, expansion of Medicaid would further strain 2 the state General Fund, where Medicaid is already the largest line-item; and 3 WHEREAS, the Legislature intends to build upon the reforms of 2012 and continue to work toward repairing the 5 6 problems within the existing system and ensuring that the most 7 vulnerable citizens of Alabama have access to quality health 8 care; and 9 WHEREAS, the Legislature has no intention of 10 allocating funds to support Medicaid expansion; now therefore, 11 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 12 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we express our intention that 13 the State of Alabama not expand Medicaid above its current 14 eligibility levels. 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be delivered to Governor Robert Bentley and the 16 17 members of the Alabama Congressional Delegation.
