1	A. It is unlawful for a person to organize, cause,
2	sponsor, arrange, hold or participate in a coyote-killing
3	contest.
4	B. As used in this section, "coyote-killing
5	contest" means an organized or sponsored competition with the
6	objective of killing coyotes for prizes or entertainment.
7	C. Organizing, causing, sponsoring, arranging or
8	holding a coyote-killing contest consists of a person:
9	(1) knowingly planning, organizing or enticing
10	a person to participate in a coyote-killing contest; or
11	(2) knowingly providing the venue for a
12	coyote-killing contest.
13	D. Participation in a coyote-killing contest
14	consists of a person knowingly taking part in a coyote-killing
15	contest.
16	E. A person who organizes, causes, sponsors,
17	arranges or holds a coyote-killing contest is guilty of a
18	misdemeanor.
19	F. A person who participates in a coyote-killing
20	contest is guilty of a petty misdemeanor.
21	G. Nothing in this section shall be construed to
22	prohibit a person from protecting a person or property, unless
23	otherwise prohibited by law."
24	SECTION 32. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the

provisions of this act is July 1, 2015.
