A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING OFFENSES AGAINST AN UNBORN CHILD.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill defines "person" for the purposes of homicide and assault offenses as a human being and includes an unborn child at every stage of gestation from conception until live birth. For purposes of a prosecution of a homicide or assault offense, the bill does not apply to:

- ! An act committed by the mother of her unborn child;
- ! A medical procedure performed by a physician or other licensed medical professional at the request of a mother of her unborn child or the mother's legal guardian; or

11	AS DESCRIBED IN SECTIONS 18-3-202 TO 18-3-205, MEANS A HUMAN BEING
12	AND INCLUDES AN UNBORN CHILD AT EVERY STAGE OF GESTATION FROM
13	CONCEPTION UNTIL LIVE BIRTH.
14	SECTION 4. Potential appropriation. Pursuant to section
15	2-2-703, Colorado Revised Statutes, any bill that results in a net increase
16	in periods of imprisonment in the state correctional facilities must include
17	an appropriation of moneys that is sufficient to cover any increased
18	capital construction and operational costs for the first five fiscal years in
19	which there is a fiscal impact. Because this act may increase periods of
20	imprisonment, this act may require a five-year appropriation.
21	SECTION 5. Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect
22	July 1, 2015, and applies to offenses committed on or after said date.
23	SECTION 6. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds
24	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
25	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety
