## AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill establishes a procedure for the selection of delegates to an Article V convention. The bill limits delegates' authority to consideration of amendments that are within the legitimate scope of the Article V applications. Delegates who consider unauthorized amendments may be recalled by the secretary of state.

II. A list of 7 alternate delegates shall be selected and given priority as follows. The first
alternate delegate shall be appointed by the senate. The second shall be appointed by the house of

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1 representatives. This method of alternating appointments shall continue until the full number is  $\mathbf{2}$ reached.

3 III. In the event that any delegate is unable or unwilling to serve or continue to serve, or if the delegate becomes disqualified as provided herein, the secretary of state shall immediately notify 4 the first-named alternate that he or she has been appointed a delegate. The secretary of state shall  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 also immediately notify the presiding officer of the convention that a replacement delegate has been  $\overline{7}$ named.

8 IV. The expenses of the delegates to the convention shall be paid at the same per diem rate 9 as received by members of the general court.

10 20-C:3 Authority of Delegates.

11 I. No delegate from New Hampshire to the Article V convention shall have the authority to 12allow consideration, consider, or approve an unauthorized amendment. Improper support includes, 13but is not limited to, making or seconding a motion, voting for, or otherwise taking any formal action 14in favor of an unauthorized amendment to the Constitution.

15II. Any vote taken by a delegate from New Hampshire at the Article V convention in 16violation of paragraph I shall be null and void. Any delegate making this vote shall be immediately 17disqualified from serving as a delegate to the Article V convention. Any other delegate from New 18Hampshire who believes that such disqualifying action has been taken by another delegate shall 19immediately report the same to the secretary of state. Upon receiving written or other recorded 20evidence of improper support by a delegate, the secretary of state shall take immediate action to 21revoke the credentials of the offending delegate and immediately issue new credentials to the first-22named alternate.

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III. Every delegate from New Hampshire to the Article V convention called for by the Article 24V application shall be required to take the following oath:

25"I do solemnly swear or affirm that to the best of my abilities, I will, as a delegate to the Article V 26convention, uphold the Constitution and laws of the United States of America and the state of New 27Hampshire. I will accept and will act according to the limits of the authority as a delegate granted to 28me by New Hampshire law, and I will not vote to consider or approve any unauthorized amendment 29to the Constitution for the United States of America. I understand and accept any penalties that 30 may be imposed on me by New Hampshire law for violating this oath."

31IV. The secretary of state shall certify the selection of the New Hampshire delegates in 32writing to the Article V convention and shall provide a copy of the certification to each delegate. No 33 delegate shall have authority to vote or otherwise serve as a delegate at the Article V convention 34without the certification.

35 V. The secretary of state shall notify the Article V convention and any delegate involved of 36 the automatic revocation of that delegate's certification should the delegate violate his or her pledge to act only within the limits of the authority granted by the state of New Hampshire. 37

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- 1 20-C:4 Enforcement by Attorney General; Right to Private Action.
  - I. The provisions of this chapter shall be enforced by the department of justice.
- 3 II. A New Hampshire citizen may file an action to enforce the requirements of this chapter
- 4 and shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees if successful.

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5 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
