1 Section 1. Section 729A.2, Code 2016, is amended to read as 2 follows:

3 729A.2 Violation of individual rights — hate crime.

4 <u>1. As used in this section:</u>

5 *a. "Gender expression"* means actual or perceived

6 gender-related characteristics.

7 <u>b. "Gender identity</u>" means a gender-related identity of a
8 person, regardless of the person's assigned sex at birth.

9 <u>2.</u> "*Hate crime*" means one of the following public offenses 10 when committed against any person or against a person's property because

11 of the person's race, color, religion, ancestry, national 12 origin, political affiliation, gender identity, gender

13 <u>expression</u>, sex, sexual orientation, age, unborn status, military veteran or military personnel status, or disability, or the

28 This bill includes additional, alternative elements defining 29 the various offenses labeled as hate crimes.

The bill amends Code section 729A.2 by modifying a "hate crime" to include offenses committed against a person or person's property because of the person's gender identity or

33 gender expression or because of the person's association with a34 person of a certain genderidentity or gender expression.

35 The bill defines "gender identity" to mean a gender-related

identity of a person, regardless of the person's assigned sex
 at birth. The bill defines "gender expression" to mean actual
 or perceived gender-related characteristics.

4 If a person commits an offense classified as a hate crime 5 under the bill against a person or person's property because 6 of the person's gender identity or gender expression or 7 because of the person's association with a person of a certain 8 gender identity or gender expression, the person commits one 9 of the following criminal offenses: assault in violation of 10 individual rights under Code section 708.2C; violations of 11 individual rights under Code section 712.9; criminal mischief 12 in violation of individual rights under Code section 716.6A; or 13 trespass in violation of individual rights under Code section 14 716.8(3) and (4).

15 The penalty for a person who commits a hate crime classified 16 as an assault in violation of individual rights under Code 17 section 708.2C ranges from a serious misdemeanor to a class "D" 18 felony depending on the circumstances of the offense.

The penalty for a person who commits a hate crime that is 19 20 a violation of individual rights under Code section 712.9 is 21 reclassified and punished as an offense one degree higher than 22 the underlying offense, resulting in the following punishments: 23 for violations of Code sections 712.3 (arson in the second 24 degree) punishable as a class "B" felony, 712.4 (arson in the 25 third degree) punishable as a class "D" felony, 715.5 (reckless 26 use of fire or explosives) punishable as an aggravated 27 misdemeanor, 712.6 (explosive or incendiary materials or 28 devices) punishable from an aggravated misdemeanor to a class 29 "B" felony, 712.7 (false reports) punishable as a class "C" 30 felony, or 712.8 (threats) punishable as a class "C" felony. The penalty for a person who commits a hate crime that is 31 32 criminal mischief in violation of individual rights under Code 33 section 716.6A is reclassified and punished as an offense one 34 degree higher than the underlying offense, resulting in the 35 following punishments: for violations of Code section 716.5

5 The penalty for a person who commits a hate crime that is a 6 trespass in violation of individual rights under Code section 7 716.8(3) is a serious misdemeanor and a person who commits a 8 hate crime that is a trespass in violation of individual rights 9 under Code section 716.8(4) commits an aggravated misdemeanor.
