AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION: ENACTING THE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT ACT; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] SHORT TITLE. -- This act may be cited as the "Professional Development Act"."

Section 2. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] PURPOSE OF ACT. -- It is the purpose of the Professional Development Act to:

establish a framework for professional development within the department of education to facilitate statewide planning and adoption of professional development

programs in school districts to ensure that New Mexico public schools have a quality work force;

- B. provide school personnel with a variety of professional development opportunities and ongoing support to ensure integration of effective teaching strategies, learning technologies and use of resources in the educational process to enhance student learning and performance; and
- C. establish a funding mechanism that supports the development of an effective school personnel work force for the benefit of all students in New Mexico."
- Section 3. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] STATE BOARD DUTIES--PROFESSIONAL
DEVELOPMENT PLANS.--The state board shall:

- $\label{eq:A. administer} \textbf{A.} \quad \textbf{administer the provisions of the Professional} \\ \textbf{Development Act;}$
- B. develop and adopt, in cooperation with school districts and their communities, a professional development framework with criteria for schools and school districts to use in creating plans for professional development consistent with school, school district, state and national goals that will enhance student achievement and performance;
- C. assist schools and school districts to develop a comprehensive plan based on the state board's planning framework;

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- D. develop and administer a process for the review and approval of school district professional development plans; and
- E. distribute funds to school districts upon approval of each school district's professional development plan as addressed in its educational plan for student success."
- Section 4. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] SCHOOL DISTRICTS--PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT
PLANS. --

- A. A school district shall adopt and implement a professional development plan for its local school board and all administrators, teachers and other personnel employed by the district. The professional development plan shall be updated annually to ensure that the proposed plan is consistent with national, state and school district goals and objectives.
- B. Each school district shall submit a proposed professional development plan to the state board that meets state board professional development guidelines and standards.
 - C. Proposed professional development plans shall:
- (1) be developed in collaboration with certified and noncertified school personnel;
- (2) show evidence of how the plans will enhance student academic achievement and support the attainment of school district, state and national goals; and

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- (3) include a parent and community involvement component and appropriate evaluation procedures.
- D. Proposed professional development plans shall be designed to respond to local needs and may include the following:
- (1) standards-based educational reform innovations that will assist in the attainment of national and state educational goals and content standards, with benchmarks and supporting assessment practices;
- (2) knowledge and skills to assist teachers in meeting the individual needs of students, the needs of limited language-proficient students and the complex challenges encountered in the classroom:
- (3) knowledge and skills to assist in the use of technology in education and technology applications that will enhance student learning and professional development, such as technology-enhanced curricula and instruction and administrative resources and services for the public schools;
- (4) professional development activities to assist teachers in preparing for national certification through the national board for professional teaching standards;
- (5) career ladder programs for educational assistants and noncertified school employees to improve jobrelated skills; and
 - (6) methods to successfully implement

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inclusion, transition and unified systems to meet the local needs of all students with developmental disabilities."

Section 5. APPROPRIATIONS. --

Four million five hundred fifty-five thousand dollars (\$4,555,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the state department of public education for expenditure in fiscal years 1998 and 1999 for the purpose of making distributions on a per unit basis to school districts to implement approved professional development plans. unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1999 shall revert to the general fund.

Four hundred forty-five thousand dollars (\$445,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the state department of public education for expenditure in fiscal year 1998 for the purpose of making an equal distribution to each school district to design a professional development plan. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1998 shall revert to the general fund.
