Section 1. That section 2307.382 be amended and sections	12
9.57 and 3501.40 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as	13

Sec. 9.57. (A) Notwithstanding any contrary provision of	15
the Revised Code, no public official shall issue an order to	16
close all places of worship in the state or in a geographic area	17
of the state.	18
(B) As used in this section:	19
(1) "Place of worship" means a building or grounds where	20
activities of an organized religious group are conducted.	21
(2) "Public official" means any elected or appointed	22
officer, employee, or agent of the state or any political	23
subdivision, board, commission, bureau, or other public body	24

Sec. 2307.382. (A) A court may exercise personal	26
jurisdiction over a person who acts directly or by an agent, as	27
to a cause of action arising from the person's:	28
(1) Transacting any business in this state;	29
(2) Contracting to supply services or goods in this state;	30
(3) Causing tortious injury by an act or omission in this	31
state;	32
(4) Causing tortious injury in this state by an act or	33
omission outside this state if he the person regularly does or	34
solicits business, or engages in any other persistent course of	35
conduct, or derives substantial revenue from goods used or	36
consumed or services rendered in this state;	37
(5) Causing injury in this state to any person by breach	38
of warranty expressly or impliedly made in the sale of goods	39
