Makes FY 2020 supplemental appropriation of \$10 million for healthcare and residential facility sanitation due to coronavirus disease 2019 outbreak.

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14 The amount herein appropriated for Health Care and Residential 15 Facility Sanitation shall be used to provide financial assistance to certain health care and residential facilities in meeting the sanitation 16 17 demands imposed by the coronavirus disease 2019, also known as 18 COVID-19, outbreak. These facilities shall be limited to: nursing 19 homes; long-term care facilities; Program of All-inclusive Care for 20 the Elderly, or PACE, facilities; federally qualified health centers; 21 urgent care facilities; retirement centers; senior centers; 22 intermediate care facilities; State developmental centers; group homes for individuals with medical needs; State psychiatric 23 hospitals; post-acute rehabilitation centers; medical day care 24 25 centers; residential schools for children with complex medical 26 needs; group homes for individuals with mental health, substance 27 use, or behavioral health conditions; and homeless shelters. No 28 later than five days following the effective date of P.L. . c. 29 (pending before the Legislature as this bill), the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting, in collaboration with 30 Commissioners of Health, Human Services, Children and Families, 31 and Community Affairs, shall determine the methodology for 32 33 allocation of the funds across the applicable facilities. No later than 34 10 days following the effective date of P.L., c. (pending before 35 the Legislature as this bill), the Director of the Division of Budget

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1 and Accounting shall transfer such funds to the applicable 2 departments and divisions for distribution to the facilities. 3 4 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 5 6 7 **STATEMENT** 8 9 This bill makes an FY 2020 supplemental appropriation of \$10 10 million for health care and residential facility sanitation due to the 11 coronavirus disease 2019 outbreak. 12 Under the bill, the \$10 million application is to be used to 13 provide financial assistance to certain health care and residential facilities in meeting the sanitation demands imposed by the 14 15 coronavirus disease 2019, also known as COVID-19, outbreak. 16 These facilities are limited to: nursing homes; long-term care 17 facilities; Program of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly, or PACE, 18 facilities; federally qualified health centers; urgent care facilities; retirement centers; senior centers; intermediate care facilities; State 19 20 developmental centers; group homes for individuals with medical 21 needs; State psychiatric hospitals; post-acute rehabilitation centers; 22 medical day care centers; residential schools for children with 23 complex medical needs; group homes for individuals with mental 24 health, substance use, or behavioral health conditions; and homeless 25 shelters. 26 No later than five days following the effective date the bill, the 27 Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting, in collaboration with Commissioners of Health, Human Services, Children and 28 29 Families, and Community Affairs, shall determine the methodology 30 for allocation of the funds across the applicable facilities. No later 31 than 10 days following the effective date the bill, the Director of the 32 Division of Budget and Accounting shall transfer such funds to the applicable departments and divisions for distribution to the 33 34 facilities. 35 COVID-19 is a respiratory disease caused by a novel coronavirus that was first detected in China and which has now been detected in 36 37 60 locations internationally, including in the United States. Reported illnesses have ranged from mild to severe, including 38 39 illness resulting in death. According to the federal Centers for 40 Disease Control and Prevention, it is likely that at some point, widespread transmission of COVID-19 in the United States will 41 42 occur. On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the coronavirus outbreak a pandemic. 43
