## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
7	Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
8	authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
9	departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
11	officers, and of the several administrative departments,
12	boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13	Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14	and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15	certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
16	other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
17	and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and
18	prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation
19	of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of
20 21	certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," in administrative organization, further
21	providing for executive officers, administrative departments
22	and independent administrative boards and commissions, for
24	departmental administrative boards, commissions and offices,
25	for department heads and for gubernatorial appointments; in
26	organization of departmental administrative boards and
27	commissions and of advisory boards and commissions, further
28	providing for board to license private bankers; in
29	Commonwealth agency fees, further providing for Department of
30	Banking and for Pennsylvania Securities Commission; in powers
31	and duties of the Department of Banking and its departmental
32	administrative board and commission, further providing for
33	powers and duties in general, for banking supervisory powers
34	and for banking laws; repealing provisions relating to powers

and duties of the Pennsylvania Securities Commission; and making editorial changes.

3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Sections 201(a), 202, 206, 207.1(d)(1) and (2),
428, 603-A, 615-A, Article XVI heading and sections 1601, 1602
introductory paragraph and 1603 of the act of April 9, 1929
(P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, are

5 All of the foregoing departmental administrative boards and 6 commissions shall be organized or reorganized as provided in 7 this act.

8 Section 206. Department Heads.--Each administrative department shall have as its head an officer who shall, either 9 personally, by deputy, or by the duly authorized agent or 10 11 employe of the department, and subject at all times to the 12 provisions of this act, exercise the powers and perform the 13 duties by law vested in and imposed upon the department. 14 The following officers shall be the heads of the 15 administrative departments following their respective titles: 16 Secretary of the Commonwealth, of the Department of State; 17 Auditor General, of the Department of the Auditor General; 18 State Treasurer, of the Treasury Department; 19 Attorney General, of the Office of Attorney General; 20 Secretary of Education, of the Department of Education; 21 Adjutant General, of the Department of Military Affairs; 22 Insurance Commissioner, of the Insurance Department; 23 Secretary of Banking and Securities, of the Department of 24 Banking and Securities; 25 Secretary of Agriculture, of the Department of Agriculture; 26 Secretary of Transportation, of the Department of 27 Transportation; 28 Secretary of Health, of the Department of Health; 29 Secretary of Drug and Alcohol Programs, of the 30 Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs;

3	of Banking and Securities shall, subject to any inconsistent
4	provisions in this act contained, continue to exercise the
5	powers and perform the duties by law vested in and imposed upon
6	the said department, the Banking Department, the Commissioner of
7	Banking, and the Secretary of Banking and the Pennsylvania
8	<u>Securities Commission</u> .
9	Section 1602. Banking Supervisory PowersThe Department of
10	Banking and Securities shall have supervision over:

12	Section 1603. Banking LawsThe Department of Banking <u>and</u>
13	Securities shall enforce and administer the laws of this
14	Commonwealth in relation to all corporations and persons under
15	its jurisdiction, and shall see that the greatest possible
16	safety is afforded to depositors therein or therewith, and to
17	other interested persons.

22	Section 2801-B. Pennsylvania Securities CommissionThe

26	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
