AN ACT

- 1 Providing for access to long-term care facilities for essential
- caregivers, for additional safety requirements for residents
- of long-term care facilities, for suspension of access for
- 4 essential caregivers and for personal protective equipment
- 5 for essential caregivers.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Short title.
- 9 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Access to
- 10 Long-Term Care Facilities Act.
- 11 Section 2. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Declaration of disaster emergency." A disaster emergency
- 16 declared by the Governor under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to
- 17 general authority of Governor).
- 18 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.

- 1 "Essential caregiver." An individual, whether a family
- 2 member or friend of a resident of a long-term care facility, who
- 3 is designated by the resident or appointed by an individual with
- 4 decision-making authority for the resident to provide physical
- 5 or emotional support to the resident during a declaration of
- 6 disaster emergency.
- 7 "Long-term care facility." A facility licensed by the
- 8 department or the Department of Human Services, including, but
- 9 not limited to, a long-term care nursing facility, a skilled
- 10 nursing facility, an assisted living facility, a personal care
- 11 home, an older adult daily living center, an independent long-
- 12 term care facility or an intermediate care facility for
- 13 individuals with intellectual disabilities.
- 14 Section 3. Access to long-term care facilities for essential
- 15 caregivers.
- 16 The department, in consultation with the Department of Human
- 17 Services, shall establish protocols to allow a resident of a
- 18 long-term care facility or an individual with decision-making
- 19 authority for the resident to designate an individual as the
- 20 resident's essential caregiver during a declaration of disaster
- 21 emergency. An essential caregiver shall meet the necessary
- 22 qualifications to enter the long-term care facility to provide
- 23 in-person physical or emotional support to a resident of a long-
- 24 term care facility in accordance with the protocols established
- 25 under this section. The protocols shall include all of the
- 26 following:
- 27 (1) Safety measures for an essential caregiver,
- including, but not limited to, restrictions on travel,
- 29 enhanced testing for communicable diseases and the necessary
- 30 safety equipment required to protect the health and safety of

- 1 the residents of the long-term care facility.
- 2 (2) Procedures to replace an essential caregiver due to
- 3 necessary circumstances, including illness or death of the
- 4 essential caregiver.
- 5 (3) A duration, not to exceed 30 days, when a long-term
- 6 care facility may enter a lock-down phase for the purpose of
- 7 establishing safety measures for residents of the long-term
- 8 care facility and essential caregivers.
- 9 Section 4. Additional safety requirements for residents of
- 10 long-term care facilities.
- 11 A long-term care facility may establish additional safety
- 12 requirements to protect the residents of the long-term care
- 13 facility if the requirements meet all of the following criteria:
- 14 (1) The requirements are directly linked to a
- declaration of disaster emergency.
- 16 (2) The requirements are not so burdensome and onerous
- as to substantially prevent an essential caregiver from being
- able to physically or emotionally support a resident of the
- 19 long-term care facility in person.
- 20 Section 5. Suspension of access for essential caregivers.
- 21 A long-term care facility may suspend access to the long-term
- 22 care facility for an essential caregiver who violates the
- 23 protocols established under section 3, and the long-term care
- 24 facility shall allow the resident, or an individual with
- 25 decision-making authority for the resident, to immediately
- 26 designate a replacement essential caregiver.
- 27 Section 6. Personal protective equipment for essential
- caregivers.
- 29 A long-term care facility may require an essential caregiver
- 30 to provide personal protective equipment for himself or herself

- 1 or assume the cost of the personal protective equipment provided
- 2 by the facility to allow the essential caregiver to provide in-
- 3 person physical or emotional support.
- 4 Section 7. Applicability.
- 5 This act shall apply for the period commencing 15 days after
- 6 a declaration of disaster emergency and 60 days after the
- 7 termination or expiration of the declaration of disaster
- 8 emergency by executive order, proclamation or operation of law.
- 9 Section 8. Construction.
- 10 Nothing in this act shall be construed to supersede Federal
- 11 authority regarding long-term care facilities or to prevent the
- 12 department or Department of Human Services from taking necessary
- 13 actions to render the Commonwealth eligible for Federal funds or
- 14 reimbursement services provided in long-term care facilities.
- 15 Section 9. Effective date.
- 16 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
