On May 16, 2007, the Honorable Martin O'Malley, Governor, vetoed the following pieces of legislation passed by the General Assembly; the reason for the vetoes are indicated:

SB 497 Senator Haines, et al

Policy PUBLIC SAFETY – DISPOSAL OF HANDGUNS OWNED BY A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY

Authorizing a law enforcement agency to dispose of a handgun owned by the agency by selling, exchanging, or transferring the handgun to a manufacturer; and defining "manufacturer".

EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2007

HB 992 Delegate Anderson, et al

Policy CRIMINAL PROCEDURE – DRUG–RELATED OFFENSES – PAROLE ELIGIBILITY FOR SECOND OFFENDERS

Altering a specified provision concerning eligibility for parole by providing that a person convicted of a specified drug—related offense is not eligible for parole during a specified mandatory minimum sentence if the person has been convicted of a violation of a specified crime of violence arising out of the incident that resulted in the imposition of the mandatory minimum sentence.
