

Ladies and Gentlemen:


I am returning to you, the body in which it originated, House Bill 116 without my signature.

As currently drafted, this bill provides inadequate training requirements for the emergency security force members. The bill simply requires that a member receive the "training deemed necessary by the sheriff or the chief of police . . ." While I am confident that the sheriff or chief of police is perfectly able to supervise the volunteer force, I believe that the Legislature should provide more specific and more extensive training requirements. Every law enforcement officer in the state, whether volunteer or paid, must receive a sufficient amount of training in order to cope with the emergencies that may arise. For instance, other local reserve officers must comply with the qualifications in § 11-42-210(c) of the Alabama Code, conditioning the powers of a local reserve officer on certain training requirements of the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission. These volunteers will most likely be armed, are meant to protect our children from harm, and will be indemnified by the state. Failure to provide for specific, applicable training would create an unacceptable high-risk situation with the possibility of dire consequences, including the injury or death of a child, teacher, or a volunteer member.

For the foregoing reasons, I hereby veto House Bill No. 116, and I encourage you to join me in this decision.
