VETO MESSAGE - No. 253

TO THE SENATE:

I am returning herewith, without my approval, the following bill:

Senate Bill Number 2984, entitled:

"AN ACT to amend the New York state urban development corporation act, in relation to creating the dairy farm improved energy efficiency program"

NOT APPROVED

This bill would amend the Urban Development Corporation (UDC) Act to authorize the Empire State Development Corporation (ESD), in cooperation with the New York State Energy Research Development Authority (NYSERDA), to establish the Dairy Farm Improved Energy Efficiency Program. The Program would award grants or low interest loans to dairy farms that make energy efficiency improvements.

The bill is largely duplicative of ongoing NYSERDA programs available to assist the agricultural sector. For example, the New York State Clean Energy Fund helps demonstrate new technologies, provides technical assistance for farm management best practices and controlled environmental agriculture, and provides tools and resources to assist farming operations, including mechanisms for financing these activities.

Moreover, while the proposed Program would help dairy farmers manage their high energy costs, no funding source has been identified to help them do so. ESD would therefore need to divert funds from other ongoing programs in order to implement this Program. Such an initiative is best taken up in the context of the state budget.

The bill is disapproved.
