

## 1995 VETO MESSAGES OF HOUSE BILLS

This legislation, which expands the DWI Grant Council, is vetoed because the Council's membership is currently adequate to accomplish its mission.

### **H 419 LIMITED DRIVER'S LICENSE REQUIREMENTS**

April 5, 1995

#### **HOUSE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 95**

I have this day VETOED and am returning HOUSE BILL 419, as amended, enacted by the Forty-Second Legislature, State of New Mexico, First Session, 1995.

This bill would expand the use for a limited driver's license for first-time DWI offenders beyond the current privilege. It is vetoed because it would erode the existing DWI reforms before their full effectiveness has been realized.

### **CS/H 425 OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ACT**

#### **HOUSE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 123**

I have this day VETOED and am returning HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL 425, as amended, enacted by the Forty-Second Legislature, State of New Mexico, First Session, 1995.

This legislation would enact an Occupational Therapy Act to regulate persons offering occupational therapy services to the public, creating another professional licensing board. It is vetoed because the regulation of this particular profession will be addressed in the executive review of the organizational structure for all existing professional and occupational licensing boards and commissions.
