1995 VETO MESSAGES OF SENATE BILLS

This legislation would require alcohol servers to complete alcohol server training within 90 days of beginning employment and would allow a liquor licensee to fire a person who fails to undergo and complete such training. It is vetoed because current law already prohibits individuals from serving liquor without proof to the employer that they have taken a course.

SENATE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 99

I have this day VETOED and am returning SENATE BILL 900, as amended, enacted by the Forty-Second Legislature, State of New Mexico, First Session, 1995.

This legislation would require the Commission on Higher Education to implement an early intervention scholarship and partnership program. It is vetoed because funding for such a program is not available at this time.

S 907 INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENTS

SENATE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 84

I have this day VETOED and am returning SENATE BILL 907, as amended, without emergency clause, enacted by the Forty-Second Legislature, State of New Mexico, First Session, 1995.

This legislation is vetoed because it amends the Tort Claims Act in regard to jointly operated facilities and joint powers agreements and could increase the state's exposure to liability.
