SENATE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 132

I have this day VETOED and am returning SENATE PUBLIC AFFAIRS COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL 1118, as amended, enacted by the Forty-Second Legislature, State of New Mexico, First Session, 1995.

This legislation pertains to gender-based scheduling of access to golf tee times for all members at private clubs. It is vetoed because the affected organizations have voluntarily amended their bylaws to correct the problem.

S 1124 LEGISLATOR HEALTH CARE COVERAGE

SENATE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 87

I have this day VETOED and am returning SENATE BILL 1124, as amended, enacted by the Forty-Second Legislature, State of New Mexico, First Session, 1995.

This legislation proposes health insurance coverage for ex-legislators under the state Retiree Health Care Authority. This legislation is vetoed because it clearly violates Article IV, Section 10 of the New Mexico Constitution which precludes any legislative compensation other than per diem and mileage reimbursement.

S 1127 "PRIVATE CELEBRATION" DEFINITION
